DESTINATION IMAGINATION

Destination Imagination (DI) is a project based, kid-driven program that teaches kids to be innovative problem solvers. Using STEAM, teams of students collaborate, think outside the box and create unique solutions to one of seven different challenges in preparation for a fun, problem-solving competition. Each DI team is a group of between 2 and 7 members that work together to develop a solution to one of the Team Challenges. Teams are responsible for designing and creating 100% of their Team Challenge solution.

Parents are invited to participate as Team Managers. Team managers are there to supervise, provide resources, and teach skills, teamwork and problem-solving skills. The Team Members generate the ideas, execute the ideas, and plan a performance showcasing their ideas.
